From the Treasurer

Our net loss for 12 months ending July 2017 is \$355, which compares to a net gain of \$696 the previous 12 months. Membership dues income was \$358, compared to \$378 for the previous 12 months.

Involvement in community events (Children's Museum International Festival and the July 4 parade) had a net income of \$6.

Our current assets are \$5033, all cash. This compares to \$4889 for July 2016. Our only liability is \$472 accrual for the 2018 SON District 5 Conference. Last year we had \$28 net overage for the 2016 District 5 Conference.

Our financial status is within 10% of last year, and the decrease is mainly due to loss of income from canceling the 2017 Taste of Scandinavia. There are no major expenses or income expected in the near future.

Ja, vi elsker

Do you know the words to "Ja, vi elsker dette landet"? One of the Lodge goals this fall is for all members to learn the words to the Ja, vi elsker.

This patriotic anthem has been commonly regarded as the de facto national anthem of Norway since early the 20th century, after being used alongside *Sønner av Norge* since the 1860s. However, Ja, vi elsker has never actually received formal status as the official National Anthem - *Sønner av Norge* is still the official one, but very few Norwegians are aware of this (as it is hardly ever used). Nonetheless, Ja, vi elsker has established itself firmly as the true Anthem in the hearts of Norwegians since it was first presented more than 140 years ago.

The lyrics were written by Bjørnstjerne Bjørnson between 1859 and 1868, and the melody was written by his cousin, Rikard Nordraak sometime during the winter of 1863-1864. It was first performed publicly on 17 May 1864 in connection with the 50th anniversary of the Norwegian Constitution and, some time later, informally replaced the previous national anthem *Sønner av Norge* (Sons of Norway).

Although Ja, vi elsker has a total of eight verses, only verses one, seven and eight are normally sung. The lyrics speak of the wars, struggles and significant historical events that formed the country from the Viking age until the 19th century. We will concentrate on the first verse only.

*Ja, vi elsker dette landet,
som det stiger frem,
furet, værbitt over vannet,
med de tusen hjem.
Elsker, elsker det og tenker
på vår far og mor.
Og den saganatt som senker
drømme på vår jord.
Og den saganatt som senker,
senker drømme på vår jord.*

NEWS ON DUES!

The Sons of Norway Simplified Dues Structure will take effect on Jan 1, 2018.

The individual SON membership dues will increase to \$60 per year, while the newly created Family Membership category will allow all individuals who share the same address to be members of Sons of Norway \$95 per year. All members age 16+ in a household are included in the official membership count for the lodge.

In a number of households, the Primary and Spouse members have different billing dates for their membership. Under the new structure they will be assigned a billing date as a family, using the “paid to date” of the member (primary or spouse) that is the latest in the year. This will delay payment of dues for these members by up to six months, but will still be paid in 2018.

An added feature of the Simplified Dues Structure is that members will now have the option to pay dues either annually by check or credit/debit card or monthly by an automatic withdrawal from a bank account.

For example, \$8/month will allow an entire family (those residing at the same address) to be members. (As a note, young adults who are away at college can qualify if they use the family address as their permanent address in the Sons of Norway database).
