From the Treasurer:

Our net gain for January through May 2022 was \$297, compared to a net gain of \$212 for January through May 2021 due to a \$126 profit from the Children's International Festival and \$527 income for membership dues.

Expenses of \$356 included \$208 towards the District 5 Conference, \$78 for pizza & movie, \$44 for refreshments, and \$25 for Ski for Light. This compares to \$233 expenses last January through May.

Our current assets are \$5,975 including \$5,855 in the Regions checking account, \$105 for the remaining prepaid Cumberland County Playhouse tickets, and \$15 for playing cards resale or awards. This compares to \$5,614 for May 2021. The only liability is a \$1,931 accrual for the next SON district 5 biannual conference.
