Thank you to the VOTS volunteers including Clark Brekke (VOTS gleaning coordinator), Ole Kolberg, Darla & Alan Berdal, Dee Bumpers, Elizabeth & Trygve Myhre, Paul Abelquist, and Elaine Brekke! The Shepard of Hope Food Pantry, which is hosted at Faith Lutheran Church, is a partnership with three additional local churches (Concord United Methodist Church, Farragut Presbyterian Church, and First Baptist Church of Farragut) who work together to sponsor and staff the pantry.

Our participation in that project included visiting the local farmers market at the close of business and collecting the leftover produce from the vendors, which resulted in the collection and donation of about 203 pounds of valuable food for those who benefit from local food banks.

Gleaners included 9 different VOTS Board members and their spouses through three hours of gleaning efforts, including their transportation to and from from the "job site".

The Lodge tentatively plans on continuing the gleaning project by VOTS membership next summer when with even more participation by Lodge members!

DON'T THROW OUT YOUR USED POSTAGE STAMPS YET!

Although the Sons of Norway International has discontinued its relationship with Tubfrim, District 5 is working to partner with a new organization to continue the Tubfrim program. Additional details will be available in January.

From the Treasurer:

Our net gain for January through November 2022 was \$141 compared to a net <u>loss</u> of \$147 for January through November 2021. Income included \$126 profit from the Children's International Festival and \$899 for membership dues.

\$884 in expenses included \$478 towards the District 5 Convention, \$78 for pizza & movie night, \$124 for refreshments, \$49 for Syttende Mai, and \$25 for Ski for Light.

Our current assets are \$4,863 including \$4,848 in the Regions checking account and \$15 for playing cards resale or awards. This compares to \$5,506 for November 2021. The only liability is a \$1,680 accrual for the next SON district 5 biannual convention.
