From the Treasurer:

Our net income for January through October 2023 was \$0.12, compared to a net income of \$217 for the same period in 2022.

Total income was \$886, including \$666 from SON for our share of membership dues, \$127 for lefse sales at the International Festival, and \$92 from the Norwegian Baking Class. This compares to \$910 income last year. Note that our share of SON membership dues has decreased \$118 (15%) from last year at this time.

Total expenses of \$885 included \$453 for SON insurance, \$305 towards the next District 5 Convention, \$250 for Alyssandra Abelquist's Masse Moro fee, \$113 for Syttende Mai, \$25 for Wendell Leimohn's bereavement, \$12 for tubfrim, \$38 credit balance for the July 4th picnic, \$64 credit balance for meeting refreshments, and \$170 credit balance for the torsk dinner.

This compares to \$693 expenses last January through October 2022, which included \$417 for the next District 5 Conference, \$124 for refreshments, \$78 for pizza & movie, \$49 for Syttende Mai, and \$25 for Ski-for-Light expense.

We are six years in arrears for contributing \$200 per year to Faith Lutheran Church for usage of their facilities. Consequently, we will contribute \$300 to Faith Lutheran Church starting next month for use of their facilities for the next six years.

Our current assets are \$4,958 in the Regions checking account. This compares to \$4,879 for October 2022. The only current liability is a \$1,281 accrual for the next SON district 5 biannual convention compared to \$914 last year. Our total equity is \$3,753 compared to \$3,964 for last year – a <u>decrease</u> of \$211 (5%).

Vikings of the Smokies Philatelic (postage stamp-related) Donations

While the Sons of Norway Tubfrim donation program was discontinued last year, our Lodge continues to collect philatelic material as a public service - so please continue to collect, save and donate your cancelled stamps to our collection jar available at each Lodge meeting!

The Lodge now donates our collected stamps to Stamps for the Wounded (SFTW) (<u>https://www.stampsforthewounded.org/</u>, a service organization dedicated to providing comfort and stimulating activity to U.S. Veterans through stamp collecting. SFTW sends donated postage stamps and other philatelic material and supplies to wounded, ill and isolated veterans.

VOTS members have collected and sent over 3.5 pounds (5 1-gallon freezer bags full) of used and trimmed postage stamps to SFTW recently.

Besides stamps, other kinds of needed donations include covers and other items from stamp collections; new and gently used philatelic supplies (album pages, mounts, hinges, stock books, perforation gauges, tongs, etc.); and philatelic literature (catalogues and reference books, but not philatelic magazines or newspapers).
